The Catholic Diocese of Nakuru is in Kenya-East Africa. The diocese is composed of two counties: Nakuru and Baringo. East Pokot area in Baringo county is a semi-arid area and experiences perennial droughts due to unfavorable weather conditions. Therefore, hunger and lack of water are rampant. Some sections of Nakuru County are affected by a high rate of poverty.

This has led to abandonment of the newly born. Besides babies, parents, as a result of their inability to take care of their children, just vanish and leave them, most of them at a very tender age, leading them to being taken to orphanages/children's homes. As a diocese, we run these orphanages, 7 in number (approx. 1,200 children). Others become street children. One of the orphanages is basically to rehabilitate these street children. In both cases the most affected are children.

Adding to the injury is the high cost of living caused by lack of political goodwill in the country. The Diocese of Nakuru's primary goal is the propagation of Faith. As we do that, we meet some social/humanitarian challenges that attract our attention to address tangibly. Some of the projects are: **1.** Feeding the starving community, as well as providing water for drinking and for other domestic use-by sinking wells. **2.** Helping the children in both circumstances with food, clothing, medical care, spiritual care and providing means for their education among other efforts to support them.

In summary: We wish to share our mission experience with St Thomas the Apostle, and St Mary of Assumption, to nourish them spiritually, to make them aware of the positive gains and the challenges we experience in doing our mission work. We also seek your support, so that we can help those in need. Thank you in advance for your generosity!

**The Assumption
of the Blessed
Virgin Mary**

The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, celebrated on August 15, is one of the oldest Marian feasts in the Church. Christians were already celebrating Mary's "birth into heaven" in the fifth century, while the Eastern Church called this

mystery her "Dormition."

In 1950, Pope Pius XII formally proclaimed the dogma that Mary, at the end of her earthly life, was taken body and soul into the glory of heaven.

Scripture itself does not speak directly about the Assumption. However, Revelation 12 speaks about a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet and a crown of twelve stars on her head. The Church sees this woman as a symbol of the People of God and, in a special way, as an image of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Since Mary best embodies the people of both the Old and New Testaments, her Assumption can be seen as an example of the woman's victory described in Revelation.

As we know, Mary was closely united with Jesus throughout His earthly life, so it is fitting that she should share fully in His heavenly glory. Her union with Christ did not end on earth; she is with Him in heaven, body and soul. We also recognize her as the Mother of the Church. Let us all, like Mary, proclaim the greatness of the Lord, because He has done marvelous things for us.

Send your Spirit to open their minds to all that is true
and beautiful and good.
Help them to see the gifts and talents you have given
