### The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

On August 15th, we celebrate the glorious Assumption of Mary. When, at the end of her earthly life, she was taken body and soul to be crowned as our Holy Queen in Heaven.

There is a common misconception that we Catholics worship Mary. Not true. We honor & venerate her. She is the mother of God and, for nine months, was the Ark of the New Covenant; the Tabernacle of God. She was truly sinless, for God would not dwell inside a body stained with sin. As the angel Gabriel greeted her, he announced, "Hail Mary, full of grace..." (Luke 1:28). When Eve disobeyed, Mary as the new Eve, accepted her fate by declaring, "May it be done to me according to your word." (Luke 1:38).

Also, Mary is one of the chief adversaries to Satan. Where Lucifer, God's favored angel rebelled, Mary, a human, obediently embraced God's divine plan. Through His Divine Gace, Mary stands as Lucifer's greatest opponent (Rev 12). This is why the rosary is such a powerful weapon against the Devil.

Also, during the wedding at Cana when the wine ran out, Mary stepped in, asking Jesus to help. Though He initially appeared to refuse her request, Mary, with the wisdom of a mother, understood her Son's mission and was instrumental in bringing about His first public miracle, turning the water into wine.

She is the Holy Tabernacle, His Holy Mother, and our Holy Queen of Heaven who intercedes for us, just like in Cana.


