Soul Food By Fr. Tomy

Vocation Appreciation Sunday "Every priest begins with a humble 'Yes' — your prayers and generosity help make that possible."

This Sunday's Gospel contrasts two men in the temple — a Pharisee who boasts of his goodness and a tax collector who humbly asks for mercy. Jesus tells us that the humble man went home justified. Every true vocation begins with that same humility — not with "I am worthy," but with "Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner." God does not call the perfect; He calls those willing to be formed by His mercy.

Today we celebrate **Vocation Appreciation Sunday**, a day to give thanks for those called to serve as priests and religious, and to renew our own call to pray for and support them. In a world marked by noise, confusion, and division, the priest stands as a sign of Christ's love and truth — bringing tenderness where there is brutality, forgiveness where there is hatred, and beauty where life has grown dull.

St. John Mary Vianney said, "The priesthood is the love of the heart of Jesus." He also reminded us that if a town is left without the Holy Mass, sin will soon increase. Without the priest, there is no Eucharist — and without the Eucharist, there is no life for the Church.

Our diocese currently has 12 seminarians preparing for priesthood, and my own community, the Pallottine Fathers, has 14 seminarians in India. Each year, the diocese invests about \$45,000 per seminarian for tuition and formation. Today, I invite you to be part of this sacred mission. Would you consider spiritually adopting a seminarian — praying for him, encouraging him, and perhaps contributing to his formation?

When I was a seminarian, I was spiritually adopted by **Dr. Maria DiDonato** from Philadelphia. Even after 25 years of priesthood, we remain deeply connected. She calls me "her priest," and I remember her in every Mass I celebrate. You can share in such a beautiful bond too.

As you leave Mass this weekend, please stop by the **sign-up tables** for our seminarians. Choose one or two to pray for and support. Your prayer and generosity can help form a priest who will one day baptize your children, anoint your sick, and celebrate your family's most sacred moments.

Truly, "the priesthood is the love of the heart of Jesus."



Centennial Campaign Update: The diocese assessed each parish a Centennial Campaign tithe, which is to be used for the renovation of the outside of the cathedral in Springfield. St Mary's was assessed \$34,805.00. Due to a generous trust left to St Mary's it was agreed upon by the pastoral and finance council to use the interest money received from the trust to pay the assessment. Therefore, St Mary's was not required to do a fundraiser campaign to pay this amount. That interest was received and the tithe to the Diocese was paid this week.
