A Message from Fr. Pawel

Last week we began our OCIA class for those who desire to be baptized and enter the Catholic Church. It is important to understand what Baptism really means. Baptism is the first and most important sacrament of Christian life. Through Baptism, we are freed from sin, welcomed into the Church, united with Christ, and given new life. Most importantly, Baptism is the beginning of our journey toward eternal life with God.

Scripture is clear about the importance of Baptism. Jesus commanded His disciples: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Mt 28:19). Jesus also tells Nicodemus, "Unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God" (Jn 3:5).

Through Baptism, we are united with Jesus in His death and Resurrection. St. Paul writes, "All of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death... so that... we too might live in newness of life" (Rom 6:3–4). Through Baptism, we share in the fruits of Christ's death and Resurrection and become members of His Body, the Church.

We also become children of God by adoption. Why "by adoption"? Jesus is the Son of God by nature: He eternally comes from the Father and shares the same divine nature as the Father. We are creatures, not divine by nature. Yet through Baptism, God adopts us into His family and gives us a share in His divine life.

We can compare this to becoming a member of a royal family. A person does not simply walk in from the street and claim a royal title. Membership comes through birth or marriage. Meghan Markle, for example, was an ordinary person who became a member of the British royal family through her marriage to Prince Harry. With that membership came privileges such as protection, care, and access to things unavailable to an ordinary person and other benefits (eternal life and salvation)—but it also came with responsibilities. A royal is expected to represent the King (God), serve the public, encourage others, care for people in need, and maintain a certain standard of conduct.

In a much greater way, Baptism gives us the privilege of becoming children of God, but it also gives us responsibilities. We are called to represent our heavenly Father, his love, serve others, forgive, avoid sin (be "holy as heavenly father is holy"), and bring God's presence into the world. So why should we be baptized? Because we want to belong to Christ, become children of God, receive His grace, and ultimately enter the Kingdom of Heaven. Baptism is the beginning of the journey that leads us to eternal life with God.
